**Total Service: 39 years**

Dr Gurrapu Damodar has so far completed 18 years of service as Professor of English at Kakatiya University, out of his total service of 39 years of active teaching and research at different levels since November 1978.

**Qualifications and Training**



He obtained M A, M Phil, Ph D from Kakatiya University, Post Graduate Certificate in the Teaching of English (PGCTE) and Post Graduate Diploma in the Teaching of English (PGDTE) from Central Institute of English and Foreign Languages (now EFLU), Hyderabad. He underwent the training in “Skills for Adolescents”, Mumbai, “The Art of Living”, Bangalore, and the “Computer Mediated Communication” (CMC), Language Learning Resource Center (LLRC), Stockholm University, Sweden, in 2000.

**Research Projects**

He has completed two UGC Research Projects on “Distance Education” and “CALL Packages in English”. He undertook the first Major Research Project of the Department of English on ‘Tribal Studies in English’ in March 2010. He was the Deputy Coordinator of SAP of UGC granted to the Department on “Multiculturalism in Indian Literature in English” from Sep 2011 to April 2013, and the Coordinator of SAP from May 2013 to January 2014.

**Visits Abroad (20 countries)**

On a UGC grant, he was at the LLRC, Stockholm University, Sweden, during February -March 2000 to demonstrate his Computer Assisted Language Learning (CALL) Packages in English. He underwent a unique training program in devising data-driven language learning packages in English at LLRC and visited twenty universities and language centers in Sweden, Denmark and the UK. In March 2009, he attended the 20th Annual Teaching Academic Survival Skills Conference at Atlantic Palm Beach University, Florida, USA and presented the paper, “Language Theater for Teaching English” making it an audio-visual presentation. That resulted in establishing Medha Language Theatres by Dr A Chiranjeevi across India with latest digital technology ([www.medhaspokenenglish.com](http://www.medhaspokenenglish.com)). In May 2012, he visited Malaysia and Singapore and interacted with Prof Rita Elaine Silver, Dept of Language and Literature, National Institute of Education, Singapore, on “SL Learning Methods and Classroom Applications” and studied “Speak Good English Movement in Singapore” during May 28 – June 4, 2012. He presented the paper “Telangana

Telugu and American English: The Classical Touch” (with M. Rajeshwar) at University of Genoa, Italy, on May 31, 2013 and visited eleven countries in Europe and Egypt covering the UK, The Netherlands, Austria, Belgium, France, Italy, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Spain, Switzerland, Tunisia and Vatican during May–June 2013. In May 2014, he visited Nepal. During Sept – October 2014, he visited America for the second time. He visited Australia and New Zealand in May 2015. He visited the USA twice in 2016.

### **Administrative Experience**

He has served Kakatiya University as the Founder Director of Students Welfare Center, KU, and the Founder Coordinator of University Foreign Relations Office for three years, the Coordinating Officer, UGC Unit, KU, during 2005–2007, Dean, College Development Council, 2015-2017, Coordinator, IQAC, Chairman, BOS in English, HOD in English and Dean, Faculty of Arts for two years each, with commitment. Currently, he is the Director, Centre for Foreign Relations, Research and Consultancy (CFRAC), KU. He has made 355 scholars turn to KU from 26 countries.

### **Publications**

He has to his credit 69 books written and edited, and 84 articles presented and published. He has devised 23 innovative audio-visual teaching aids with CD ROMs during 2000-2010. He has so far guided 23 dissertations for M.Phil. and Ph.D. and adjudicated about ninety theses and dissertations. He has produced over a hundred radio lessons on Spoken English, English for Competitive Examinations, etc., which were broadcast every Sunday on Warangal FM. Now they are available on CDs and in MP4 Format. He has contributed a video program, “Aesthetics of Film Adaptation” to the Countrywide Classroom Program of UGC.

He has written and edited the course material on ELT for School of Distance Learning and Continuing Education (SDLCE), Kakatiya University, covering ninety units, PGRR Centre for Distance Education, Osmania University, covering ten units, Bhavan Institute of English (BIE), Hanamkonda, a Multimedia Center for Spoken English with Life Skills, established in 1978 by him, and 4-in-1 dictionary and seven other books by New Vision Publications, Hyderabad.

His books, *English for Email*, *Errors in English Usage*, *Detection of Errors*, *English for Engineers and Computer Professionals* (by 21 Century Publications) *New Millennium Graded English Course* (by Arkbird Publishers), *English for Empowerment* (by Orient Blackswan with a CD), *English Tracks* (by Macmillan with a CD), *Communication Skills* (by SDLCE, KU), *Nurturing English* (by Lorven) and *A Course in Listening and Speaking* (with a CD) are prescribed as textbooks at different levels, fetching handsome royalty for him.

He has translated Shakespeare's *The Two Gentlemen of Verona*, Eliot's "Burnt Norton" into Telugu, T. Srirangaswamy, Kaloji and K. Veera Reddy's poems and two booklets on *Aandaalu* and *Sri Ramachandrudu* of Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams, into English. His latest obsession is writing haikus. He has plans to bring out haiku books on Sri Aurobindo and Indian Philosophy. He conducts sessions these days on creative writing and other life skills.

### **Seminars Attended and Conducted**

He has attended 28 national and 16 international seminars, conferences and workshops. He has organized 61 seminars and workshops in Warangal, Nellore, Borsad, Gujarat and other places.

### **Extension Services**

He has been on the selection committees of several universities such as Andhra University, Acharya Nagarjuna University, PS Telugu University, Osmania University, KL University, Berhampur University, University of Hyderabad, JNTU, University of Rajasthan, Manomanian Sundaranar University, Thirunelveli, TN, Shivaji University, Kolhapur, Dr HS Central University, Sagar, Mandhya Pradesh, etc. He has completed about thirty assignments of APPSC, APSCHE, UPSC, UGC, Punjab, Rajasthan, Telangana Public Service Commissions, other organizations and universities.

He is a member of Board of Studies in English at Osmania University, Andhra University, PS Telugu University, Chaitanya Autonomous College, Hanamkonda, Palamur University, Sathavahana University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Knowledge Technologies, AP.

He was a Resource Person at UGC Refresher Courses in English at CIEFL, Hyderabad, Sri Venkateshwara University, Tirupathi, SDLCE, Kakatiya University, RIE of EFLU, Lucknow; at the Workshop on "Situational English" at University PG College, LB College, Masterji College, New Science College, Bharghavi Degree College, Engineering Colleges at BITS, Maheswaram, SR College, Ellapur, Christu Jyothi College, Janagaon, KITS, Warangal, Kothagudem Women's College, Devanga Arts College, Aruppukottai, Near Madhurai, TN, Training Program on ELT at NIT, Warangal and Vikrama Simhapuri University, Nellore, AP.

Currently, he is on the Executive Committees of Indian Association for Canadian Studies and Indian Association for Australian Studies.

As a member of the Committee constituted by the AP State Council of Higher Education, he has standardized the soft skills curriculum in English for all professional and non-professional colleges of AP. He is keenly interested in training the students in communication skills and personality development. He was a regular columnist for five years on “Situational English” and “English for Competitive Examinations” for *Vaaritha*, a daily newspaper, *Classmate* and *Udyogasopanam*, leading magazines for the youth. He has 900 pieces of writing to his credit covering books, articles, haikus, reviews, research papers, radio lessons, distance mode units, translations, etc. He has been actively engaged in experimentation of innovative methods, techniques and materials of English language learning and teaching since 1976. All of them will be made available on his website and YouTube soon.

He was a Member on the Nomination Committee for Nobel Prize in Literature and nominated Stephen Gill of Canada in 2014 and Mahaswetha Devi of India in 2016. He has been the Visitor’s (President’s) Nominee for Dr HS Central University, Sagar, Mandhya Pradesh, since 2015.

He loves reading the works of William Shakespeare, Swami Vivekananda, Sri Aurobindo, Rabindranath Tagore, RK Narayan and others. His latest passions are devising ELT slides and videos and writing haiku poems--150 on Sri Aurobindo's Philosophy and 500 on nature, humanism and spirituality.

He brought out a monograph on his yogic practices he has been doing since 1977.

His favourite thoughts: (1) Life is what life is. Take it as it comes. (2) Be the change you want to be. (3) Everything can be done if the God-touch is there. (4) All life is yoga. (5) Our position in life is only relative, not absolute. (6) Life is not about finding the right person, but creating the right relationship. (7) It is noticed we often give up when we are near the goal. (8) Only two types of people are happy in life--the mad and the children. Be mad to achieve a goal. Be a child to enjoy what you have achieved. (9) There is no escalator to success--only steps! (10) Success is never ending, failure is never final. (11) Either write something worth reading or do something worth writing. (12) Working for success will make us masters, but working for satisfaction will make us legends. Masters are everywhere but legends are very rare. (13) Relationship is like honey. Don't compare it with money. It is not a collection of art, but a selection of heart. (14) No one in this world is pure and perfect. If we avoid people for their little mistakes, we will always be alone. So, judge less and love more. (15) Don't be critical; be creative.
